Four great reasons to visit Jaén

1. The longest hiking trail in the largest nature reserve in Spain, the Natural Park of Cazorla, Segura y Las Villas

Jaén is Spain's green lung, the largest area of protected natural spaces in Spain with four Natural Parks, including the second largest in Europe: the Natural Park of Cazorla, Segura y Las Villas. In the heart of Southern Europe's largest forest is the longest round-trip walking trail on the continent. The **GR 247 Southern Woodlands footpath** offers 478 kilometres of signed trails to experience the Natural Park of Sierras de Cazorla, Segura y Las Villas, a paradise for adventure and nature tourism.

The trail explores the entire nature reserve in 21 main stages, with 11 forks leading to places of interest and 3 variants to help you divide the path and plan a route to suit your interests, depending on where you join the path and how much time you have. The itinerary includes the sources of the Guadalquivir and the Segura, and will lead you into a mosaic of landscapes: high mountain peaks, castles, forests, rivers and waterfalls, traditional lanes, plateaus, thriving villages, historic sites, olive groves and vegetable gardens. A wonderful way to see the flight of the bearded vulture, drink the clearest water, enjoy a conversation with travelling shepherds, see the way of life of mountain villages... unique experiences and the largest and most unspoiled natural landscapes of Andalusia await you along the path. 2. Úbeda and Baeza, the Southern Renaissance in a World Heritage site

These two cities are the supreme examples of the Renaissance architecture to be found throughout the province, along with the city of Jaén and its cathedral, another of the masterworks of Andrés de Vandelvira. The streets of Úbeda and Baeza conserve their original layout from the remote past and the magic of 500 years of history, surrounded by olive groves with the River Guadalquivir at their feet. Úbeda represents private architecture and civil power, and Baeza public architecture and religious power. The nearby castle of Sabiote is also well worth visiting.

4. The historic heritage of a decisive crossroads in European history

The province of Jaén was the scene of three legendary battles which changed the course of history (Baécula, Navas de Tolosa and Bailén). It was also the first settling place of the Iberians, that early and enigmatic culture, and has 18 historic sites and a group of caves with prehistoric art, declared a World Heritage Site. To relive events which changed the history of Spain, we offer the **Route of Castles and Battles** (www. castillosybatallas.com), with re-enactments and dramatised tours in the territory with the most castles in Europe.

The **Journey to the Time of the Iberians** (www.viajealtiempodelosiberos.com) guides you to seven places in the province where you can see at first hand the extraordinary archaeological heritage of this culture, such as the Cupids Mosaic or the Lion recently discovered in Cástulo (Linares).
