3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than **5** weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. *[It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]*

4. Termination of the agreement

It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the Institutions

I MODENA01 - Marks awarded at Italian universities are on a scale from 18 to 30 scale (30 being the highest vote/18 the lowest). If the mark is not over 18 then the exam performance is considered unsatisfactory so no grade is written on the university student's record book. A certain number of credits are awarded for each examination. One ECTS credit in the Italian system corresponds to 25 working hours, taking account of all types of activity required (lessons, seminars, individual or group study, etc.). So 1 CFU (Credito Formativo Universitario) is equivalent to 1 ECTS credit. 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
