2. E JAEN01: The receiving institution will send its decision within 2 weeks

 D MUNCHEN06: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. At D MUNCHEN06 the assessment period ends February 14th and July 31st respectively.
4. Termination of the agreement
 In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.





