2. CY NICOSIA01: University of Cyprus as the receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks.
3. E JAEN01: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
3. CY NICOSIA01: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the University of Cyprus no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.


